

The number of participants reached was 13 (21 together with the speakers and the participants from p-consulting.gr) and the event was hosted at Zoom.







Dr Apostolos Veizis is the Executive Director and the Legal Representative of INTERSOS Hellas and Head of Mission INTERSOS - Organizzazione Umanitaria Onlus.

In the past he worked at the HQ of Medecins Sans Frontieres-Greece as Director of Medical Operational Support Unit(SOMA), Programs and Institutional relations Director and Medical Director. He was also the Head of Mission and Medical Coordinator for Medecins Sans Frontieres and Medecins Du Monde in Afghanistan, Azerbaijan, Russian Federation, Albania, Egypt, Georgia, Greece, Turkey.

He participated on assessment, emergency assignments and evaluations in Kyrgyzstan, Morocco, Armenia, Lebanon, Syria, Ukraine, Turkmenistan, Zambia, Malawi, Uzbekistan, North Macedonia, Cyprus and Tajikistan.

He is Advisory board member of the Lancet Migration European Regional Hub.

He also, participated and had announcements in international and national medical congresses and contributed on publications of relevant articles.

Prof. Apostolos Vandarakis



Mr. Apostolos Vandarakis is Professor of Hygiene at the Department of Medicine of the University of Patras. He was Assistant Professor at the Laboratory of Environmental Health and Protection at the Department of Medicine of the Democritus University of Thrace, for 4 years. He holds a B.Sc. in Biology, M.Sc. in Genetic Toxology and Ph.D. in Hygiene-Perivial Microbiology. He has supervised more than 20 European projects (European Union, FP7, Erasmus, Interreg etc.) and has/had scientific responsibility in more than 50 research projects. He has supervised research work on issues of sensitive social groups such as migrants, Roma, etc

Panagiotis G. Anastassopoulos is co-owner of p-consulting.gr. He is the National Representative of Greece in the European Forum for Vocational Education and Training (EfVET) for the last seven years. Feedback on the event

Before the end of the Multiplier Event, participants were asked to evaluate the organisational aspects and the content of the event. All the participants to the event filled in the evaluation form. All of the participants were either satisfied or very satisfied with the event and its aspects.

In the question "Will you be able to put topics presented in the workshop into practice? If yes, which ones?" we received the following feedback:

- As i am working in a training center is was very interesting how we can have training course with immigrants and especially immigrants with dissabilities.
- I'm working in an organisation for people with dissabilities and all topics were very interesting and some issues can be adapted in our organisation.
- Some of them, for example how we can work (as teachers) with immigrants with disabilities
- Most of the information given regarding training of immigrants with disabilities
- Some of them (training of people with disabilities, especially immigrants with disabilities)
- I'm working in school and i have immigrants as students, but they are children.
- Yes, i will use many of things i learned to my work.

Additionally, in the question "Do you have any comments about the workshop or its content?", we received the following feedback:

- Well organised in general.
- It was a well organised workshop
- It was a very interesting workshop.
- I would like to have more topics to be presented (more information about children with disabilities)
- I believe more time was needed and it would be better if all the participants have participated to the discussion and give their opinion and personal experiences.

- I would like more information regarding how we can teach children who are immigrants and have disabilities.
- Very interesting workshop

Conclusions

The main conclusion from the Multiplier Event is that there is a need for people to be aware of the difficulties migrants and refugees with disabilities face to integrate. During the discussion there was a share of personal experiences on the issue and with the help of the main speakers there were explored the reasons about it.

Analyzing the feedback of participants, we can see that there is a great need for methods and tools to work with migrants with disabilities in education.
